union and the city have been litigating before the Board of Mediation to decide whether certain supervisors were to be classified as employees, which would entitle them to vote in Wednesday's election. On May 23, the board issued its final decision, holding that certain personnel were employees rather than supervisors.

The city looked to appeal the decision, but the election, held on June 29, worked out in the city's favor, meaning an appeal is no longer necessary, Smith said.

Smith said he is also looking at changing some of the job descriptions to avoid further problems in the future. Smith said the description changes would help the city if a union drive were to happen again, rendering the previous Board of Mediation ruling moot because the situation is no longer the same.

After an unsuccessful election, the union can not campaign for at least 365 days from the date of the election. If, after that period has passed, a majority of employees again choose to sign union authorization cards, the process would start all over again.
